Chief Constable Paul Sanford is urging Norfolk residents to use the Street Safe online tool to report areas where they feel unsafe in the county.

The Street Safe tool enables anyone to anonymously flag public places and mark on a map the areas where they feel unsafe while remaining anonymous, and while anyone can use it, women and girls are particularly being encouraged to use the online platform.

Launched by the Home Office and Police Digital Service, the tool, which is being piloted across England and Wales until the end of November can be accessed by clicking on: [www.police.uk/streetsafe](http://www.police.uk/streetsafe)

#### WHAT'S HAPPENING IN YOUR AREA?

PC Dawson has been continuing with Engagement Surgeries with regular sessions in Swanton Novers, on Fakenham market and coming soon at Sculthorpe village hall. On 1<sup>st</sup> October PC Dawson attended the annual Fakenham town assembly along with Insp Cooper-Barnes and the new PCC, this was an opportunity to be able to answer questions relating to County Lines and Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB). It also gave them the opportunity to put peoples minds at rest over the spate of break-ins on one of the local allotment sites. Suspects have been identified and are being dealt with.

Patrol colleagues have been assisting with the SNAP priorities of tackling speeding in some of the parishes around Fakenham and also general ASB across the area. PC Dawson has also met the with the Head of the new Duke of Lancaster school which opens in January 2022 and which will care for children with special needs.

The next SNAP meeting will take place on November 10<sup>th</sup>, please email [SNTFakenham.pnn.police.uk](mailto:SNTFakenham.pnn.police.uk) for an invite. The next meeting will decide the next set of priorities for the next three months so it's a good time to have your say.

November also sees the Christmas Tree Festival and Fakenham Christmas Lights switch on events both of which will be attended as engagement events for us. Work continues in partnership with Fakenham Academy and the new structure around safeguarding and pastoral care .

### CRIME UPDATES (1st to 30th September)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	3	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary business and community	19	A person commits theft in a building or structure that is not lived in.
Burglary residential	2	Entry and theft in a building or a structure that is lived in.
Criminal Damage	6	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	12	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	2	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	7	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	1	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	0	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	1	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a BOTD.
Theft from a person	0	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.
